Happily Married After is a satirical short film that takes on the perfections and imperfections that make marriage beautiful. We all too often hold our partners to a high standard, on a pedestal, expecting them to do no wrong. Unfortunately, being humans, we have tendencies to make mistakes and mess up - but how we react to those instances can either make a marriage stronger or pull it apart.

The tone of the film will be in the style of a mockumentary/comedy. The short film is meant to be light-hearted with indirect lessons that can be learned from being in a committed relationship.







Synopsis

Laci Spark is your type A wife, married to a type B husband, Kirk. They have been selected by a documentary crew to be followed for 2 weeks and interviewed as part of a series for what makes a marriage successful. Laci is naively blind to the fragility of her marriage to Kirk. She believes that her marriage is perfect, however behind the scenes, we see that both partners (unknown to the other) overcompensate for the shortcomings of the other. That is, until Kirk uncovers this occurrence and decides to come clean - leading to the couple opening up about their hidden flaws, and fessing up to how they cover it up for the fear of disrupting their marriage, and vow to be honest in the future to help their relationship stand the test of time.

Director's Statement

My vision is to see this perspective of a relationship from a black couple, mainly because black relationships still feel like they need to be normalized. There are too many stereotypes for reasons why black relationships do not work out - so as part of my quest of being a black filmmaker, my goal is to continue to show these images to help theatrically normalize what is already existent. The reason why I am choosing to portray this as a comedy is that we too often get caught in the drama of what we believe a relationship should be. However, whenever we look back in hindsight, we start to realize how trivial some of the quirks turn out to be.

Finally, as an independent filmmaker from Minneapolis, MN I want to do more for my filmmaker community and build more of those connections. There have been so many people who have volunteered their time to be a part of my previous projects which have gained some traction through film festivals. And as part of that journey, I would like to continue to build my tribe and create those opportunities for collaborative and creative expression.
